Course Description:

English 10 will consist of three major areas—literature, grammar, and writing. The goal of this course is to help students understand a wide variety of literary styles and help them communicate their ideas effectively in speaking and writing.

The tenth grade English curriculum is based on the literature from the anthology *The Language of Literature* (Holt McDougal Publishers). For grammar and writing, we will be using the *Language Network* series by the same publishers.

During the semester we will be spending a lot of time reading, analyzing and discussing literature; and writing. Along with that, we will be studying grammar, punctuation, spelling, and usage.

Attendance

Makeup Work

Missing assignments will drastically affect your grade. Late work will be deducted points. A student will receive half credit at most. If you were in class the day before an assignment is due, it is due the next day. You have 2 days to make up a quiz or an assignment after an absence.

Independent Reading/Journal Writing

The first fifteen minutes of each class period will be dedicated to independent reading.

You are required to read **THREE BOOKS** each quarter. Each book report is worth a possible 30 points. A book of more than 300 pages counts as two books if you fill out a two-book report after reading the first part and then a second two-book report based on the last part of the book (2 book reports, each worth 30 points).

After you finish a book, fill out the Book Review Form located at the front of the room. You will only be allowed to work on the form in the classroom. You will not be allowed to use your book to fill out the form. When you are finished with the form, hand it in. You may use independent reading class time, AP, or time before or after school to complete the book report forms.

In addition, your grade will also include independent reading participation points. Having a book and reading every day during reading time will get you the participation points.

Turnitin.com

We will be using *Turnitin.com* this year for all major writing assignments.

You will need to keep track of your Gmail account information associated with the MCC domain since it will be used as your login information.

As a side note, technology related problems will not be allowed as excuses for late or missing assignments.

Please be aware of all due dates and make sure to drop all assignments in a timely manner so you may address technology issues if they arise.

At some point during the semester, you **WILL** have a problem with technology: your laptop will crash, a file will become corrupted, a server will go down, or something else will occur. *These are facts of life, not emergencies.* **Technology problems will not be accepted as excuses for unfinished or late work.** Count on 'stuff' happening and protect yourself by doing the following:

- Plan ahead – start early, particularly if scarce resources are required.
- Save work often – at least every ten minutes.
- Make regular backups of files in a different location from the originals.
- Save drafts of work at multiple stages.
- When editing, set aside the original and work with a copy.
- Practice safe computing when surfing the web and checking email.
