- **Personal pronouns take different forms depending on how they are used in sentences. The form of a pronoun is called its case.**

There are three pronoun cases: nominative, objective, and possessive. The chart below lists all of the personal pronouns and organizes them by case, number (singular or plural), and person.

Personal Pronouns			
	Nominative	Objective	Possessive
Singular			
First person	I	me	my, mine
Second person	you	you	your, yours
Third person	he, she, it	him, her, it	his, her, hers, its
Plural			
First person	we	us	our, ours
Second person	you	you	your, yours
Third person	they	them	their, theirs
