"The Sniper" (p. 162)

Setting: 1920's civil war in Ireland

On a roof-top

Sniper: expert shooter

- * Republican wanted freedom from England
- * Thin face of a student
- * Eyes gleam of a fanatic

(excessive enthusiasm – can be misguided)

Plot action:

1. Enemy car; woman informer

Turret is to shield a gunsman; woman must be shot because she is dangerous – an informer

- 2. Injury An enemy sniper shoots him after he sees his location; Injures arm badly enough so he can't operate his rifle; treats his own wound; bullet lodged in bone
- 3. Strategy Props hat up on rifle; enemy sniper shoots; fakes death by allowing cap & rifle to fall (He still has a revolver!), hangs limp hand over roof edge and then shoots when enemy sniper shows himself
- **4. Success** Smiles, Shoots with eagerness, utters cry of joy (How does he feel about what he is doing it changes!)
- **5. Remorse** (p. 166)

Irony: The war that is supposed to bring freedom and a better life, kills his brother. Situational irony: He doesn't realize he is shooting his brother (unexpected twist) Turns out different than we would expect

Theme: War can split up families; it causes great pain and loss to real people
